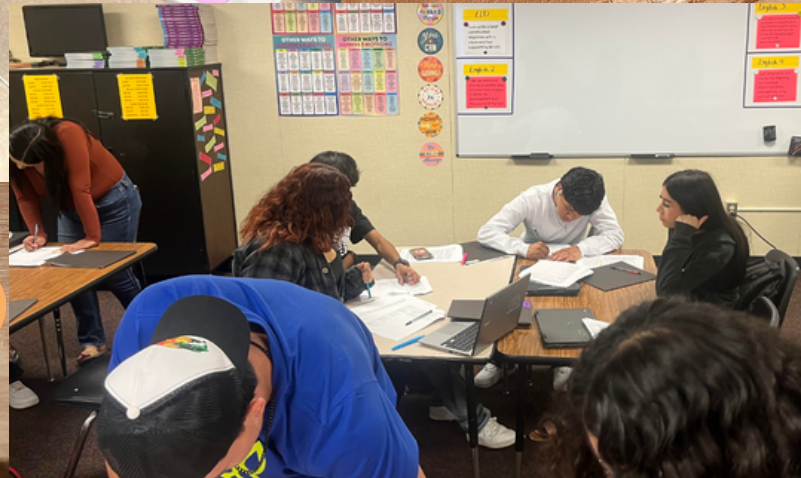
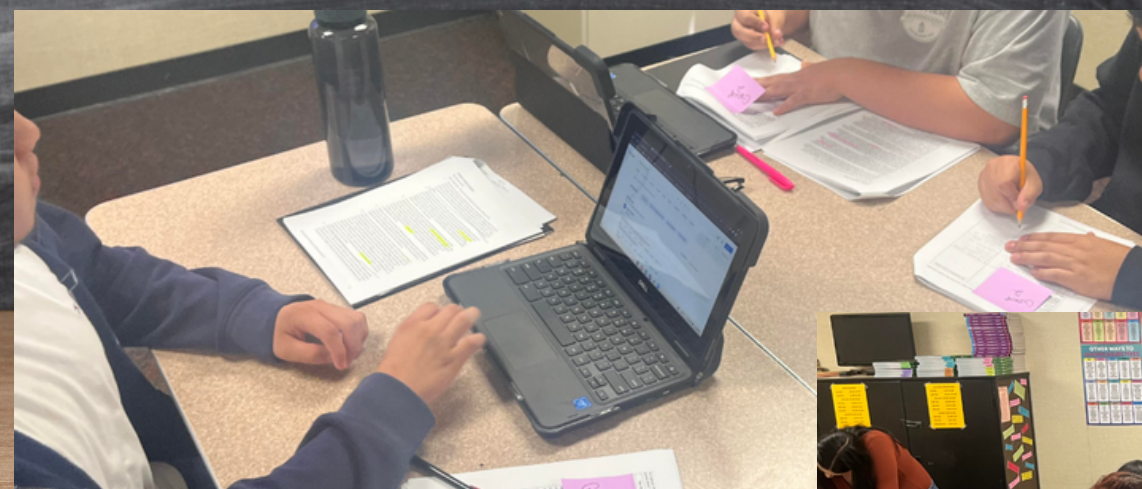
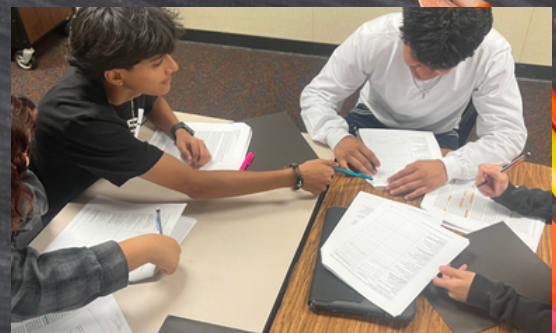
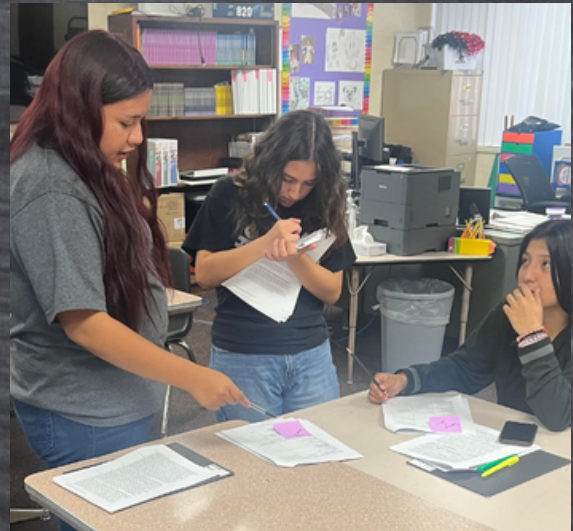
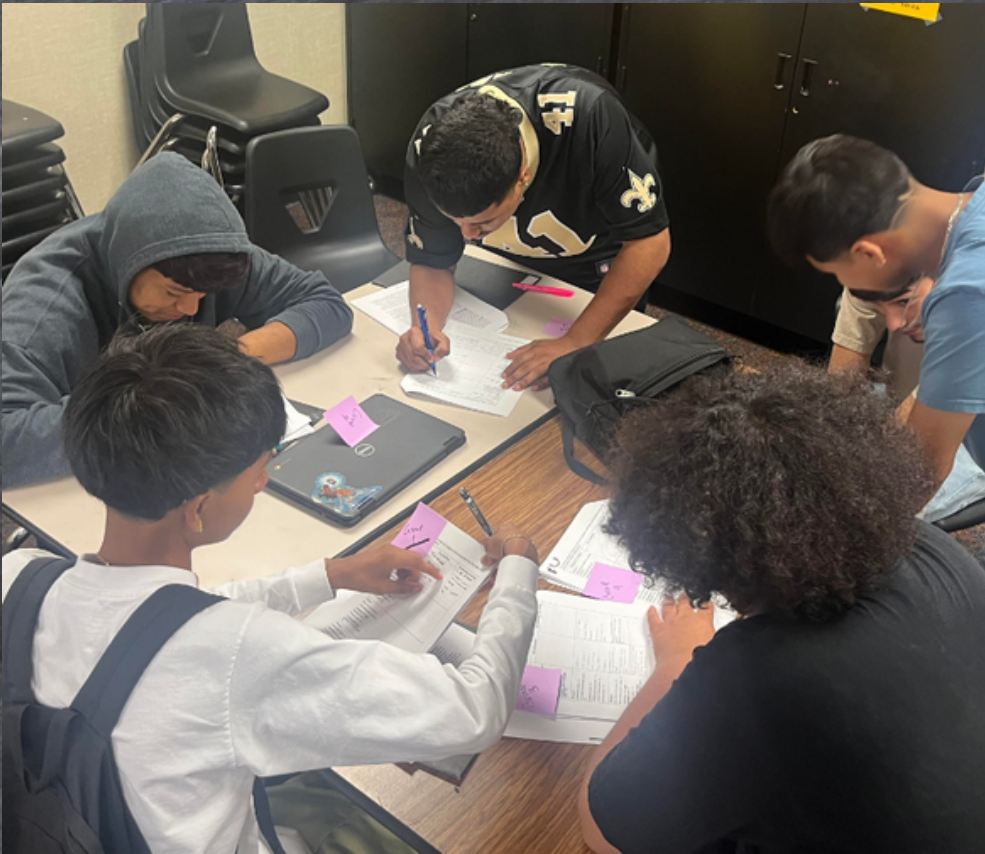




Focus on Learning
